

Vincent Van Gogh 1888



Born: 1853



Job: Artist



He was born in the Netherlands.



He had two brothers and three sisters.



Died: 1890

### Van Gogh the Painter



He painted **portraits** and **landscapes**.

He used <u>watercolours</u> and oil paints.

He is famous for using bright colours and bold brushstrokes in his work.

He painted in a style called **Post-Impressionism**.

Van Gogh's brother suggested that he become an artist. He went to art school in Brussels and started to learn

about drawing.



He visited his relative, Anton Mauve, who introduced him to painting with oil paint.



He produced his first important painting, called 'The Potato Eaters'.

He moved to Paris, where he discovered the

work of some artists called the French Impressionists.

This is one of Van Gogh's most popular and famous paintings.



# 'Starry Night' Transformation with Shape

### **T**ASK

Transform Starry Night by Van Gogh using only geometric shapes.

### **M**ATERIALS

wax paper, image of Starry Night by Van Gough, a lead pencil, white card, oil pastels or crayons

### Visual Arts: Independent task.

### **DIRECTIONS**

1. Place the wax paper over the Starry Night image.

2. Re-create the painting by drawing geometric shapes over the top of each section of the painting e.g. the wind, the moon, the buildings. Think about the best shapes to use for each part of the painting.

3. When you are finished, place the wax paper down onto the white card. Make sure the side you drew the shapes on is face down.

4. Lightly shade over the back of the wax paper to transfer the shapes onto the white card.

5. Once your shapes have been transferred, remove the wax paper. Use oil pastels or crayons to colour in each of the shapes. Make sure you check the original artwork to get the colours as accurate as possible.
