



Attendance Matters

We would like to take the opportunity to celebrate a significant shift in our student attendance in 2024. Dalmeny students are attending school more regularly and doing so at a rate higher than both our local network of schools and the state. Congratulations! We will continue to drive attendance and thank you for your ongoing support.

Below is our attendance rate for 2024 as of 16th October 2024

We are higher than both State and Network for overall attendance as well as the students attending 90% or more. The figures below are for our K-6 Mainstream enrolments in 2024.



Attendance Reward Sessions- Thursday 28th November 2024



Students who have attended school at Dalmeny during 2024 for 90% or more of the time will be rewarded with a session, at school, of fun games, obstacles and colour on 28 November. Students participating will be grouped K-2 and 3-6 for an hour of fun. To qualify to participate, students need consistent positive attendance of 90% or more for the 2024 school year. When can my child start kindergarten?


Your child can start kindergarten at the beginning of the school year if they turn five on or before 31 July in that year. By law, all children must be enrolled in school by their sixth birthday.

Students starting kindergarten in 2025 are born on or between 01/08/2019 and 31/07/2020.

If you have completed this process, our Transition to School Sessions commenced on Tuesday 6 August, with students offered the opportunity to attend an onsite, in class experience on Tuesdays weekly from 9.00 – 10.45am

ROAD SAFETY INFORMATION

YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR CHILDREN'S SAFETY WHEN THEY ARE TRAVELLING TO AND FROM SCHOOL.

Drive and park safely near schools

The beginning and end of the school day are busy times for pedestrians and drivers outside schools.

You can help keep children safe by remembering the following:

- drop off and pick up children on the school side of the road
- never call out to children from across the road it is very dangerous
- always take extra care when driving in 40km school zones
- follow all parking signs these help keep children as safe as possible
- park responsibly even if this means you have to walk further to the school gate
- never double park it is illegal and puts children at risk
- never do a U-turn or three-point turn outside the school as it puts children at risk of harm
- model safe and considerate pedestrian and driver behaviours to your children.

When travelling in a car ensure your children:

- use a booster seat if they are aged between 4 and 7 years old – it's the law
- are correctly buckled up in their seatbelts
- always get in and out of the car through the 'safety door' – the rear door on the footpath side of the car
- are never left alone in the car.

New high school in Edmondson Park Project update | October 2024

Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild public education, the 2024-25 Budget is delivering record education funding, including \$3.6 billion for new and upgraded schools in Western Sydney. This targeted investment will ensure growing communities get access to a world class public education.

The Department of Education is planning to deliver a new high school in Edmondson Park. The high school will include fit-for-purpose classrooms and core facilities to meet enrolment demand in Edmondson Park and support the growing population in South-West Sydney.

Project overview

The new high school will accommodate up to 800 students. The project is on track for completion by Day 1 Term 1 of 2027.

Progress update

We are pleased to announce that we have received approval from the NSW Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure (DPHI) for the State Significant Development (SSD) application for construction of a new high school in Edmondson Park.

We have awarded the construction contract for the new school build to Richard Crookes Constructions.

These are important milestones to providing world-class educational facilities for the rapidly growing community in Western Sydney, ensuring students have access to modern, well-equipped learning environments.

Next steps

Now that the construction contractor is engaged, the department will progress with the school's detailed design.

From late Term 4, site establishment works will begin which will include:

- Installation of site access control points and security measures.
- Placement of temporary site offices and worker amenities.
- Installation of traffic control measures for safe site access and movement.
- Implementation of erosion and sediment control measures, dust suppression, and noise management strategies.


